**A RESOLUTION TO APPROVE CONTINUED INVESTIGATION OF OPTIONS FOR THE
DELIVERY OF EMERGENCY COMMUNICATION SERVICES AND KEEPING E911
WITHIN THE CITY OF MORROW**

WHEREAS: The City of Morrow desires to investigate any and all options that may or may not lead to a decision to keep E911 services within the City of Morrow;

WHEREAS: The Intergovernmental Agreement approved on November 10, 2015, between the City of Morrow and Clayton County for E911 services will remain in place until such a time as the Morrow Mayor and Council have satisfactorily concluded their investigation into the matter;

WHEREAS: New information obtained after the agreement was approved foretold that the service delivery offered by Clayton County may not fit the service needs of the City of Morrow;

WHEREAS: Therefore, in order to move forward in the best interest of the citizens of the City of Morrow, the Morrow Mayor and Council will further investigate the options for delivering E911 Services to the community;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of Morrow, Georgia that the Morrow Mayor and Council will continue to investigate the service delivery of Emergency Communication Services.

16 WHEREAS, the governing body of the City of Morrow, Georgia ("City") is the Mayor
17 and City Council; and

18 WHEREAS, the City encompasses several sensitive areas; and

19 WHEREAS, the City endeavors to protect its scenic character through undertaking
20 proper controls on development; and

21 WHEREAS, the City regulates signage for purposes of protecting public safety in
22 addition to the City's aesthetic interests; and

23 WHEREAS, in June 2015, the U.S. Supreme Court, in *Reed v. Gilbert, Az.*, 135 S. Ct.
24 2218 (2015), issued an opinion regarding the constitutionality of content-based sign
25 regulations; and

26 WHEREAS, based upon its review of the Court's decision in *Reed v. Gilbert, Az.*, the
27 City desires to review its ordinances to determine whether they are constitutionally
28 sound; and

29 WHEREAS, the City seeks to maintain the status quo while evaluating whether it is
30 necessary to revise and/or readopt its sign ordinances and, if necessary, undertaking to
31 expeditiously revise and/or readopt its sign regulations; and

56 five (35) square feet in size, or incorporating electronic messaging equipment, or being more
57 than twenty (20) feet tall from the base to the top.

58 (b) This moratorium shall be effective as of the date of its adoption.

59 (c) This moratorium shall have no effect upon approvals or permits previously issued
60 or as to development plans previously approved by the City. The provisions of this Ordinance
61 shall not affect the issuance of permits or site plan reviews that have received preliminary or
62 final approval by the City on or before the effective date of this Ordinance.

63 (d) As of the effective date of this Ordinance, no applications to erect signs will be
64 accepted by any employee or officer of the City with respect to any property in the City, and any
65 application so accepted for filing will be deemed in error, null and void and of no effect
66 whatsoever and shall constitute no assurance whatsoever of any right to engage in any act, and
67 any action in reliance on any such permit shall be unreasonable.

68 (e) However, notwithstanding the foregoing, a written application, including verified
69 supporting data, documents, and facts, may be made which specifically requests a review by the
70 Mayor and Council at a scheduled meeting of any facts or circumstances which the applicant
71 feels substantiates a claim for the grant of an exemption from this Moratorium either by virtue of
72 an existing vested right to proceed under the existing laws and regulations, or by virtue of
73 exigent or emergency circumstances.

74 (f) The following procedures shall be put in place immediately. Under *Cannon v.*
75 *Clayton County*, 255 Ga. 63, 335 S.E.2d 294 (1985); *Meeks v. City of Buford*, 275 Ga. 585, 571
76 S.E.2d 369 (2002); *City of Duluth v. Riverbroke Props.*, 233 Ga. App. 46, 502 S.E.2d 806
77 (1998), the Supreme Court stated, “Where a landowner makes a substantial change in position by
78 expenditures and reliance on the probability of the issuance of a building permit, based upon an
79 existing zoning ordinance and the assurances of zoning officials, he acquires vested rights and is

80 entitled to have the permit issued despite a change in the zoning ordinance which would
81 otherwise preclude the issuance of a permit.” Pursuant to this case, the City recognizes that,
82 unknown to the City, de facto vesting may have occurred. The following procedures are
83 established to provide exemptions from the moratorium where vesting has occurred:

84 a. A written application, including verified supporting data, documents and facts,
85 may be made requesting a review by the Mayor and Council at a scheduled
86 meeting of any facts or circumstances which the applicant feels substantiates a
87 claim for vesting and the grant of an exemption.

88 **SECTION II.**

89 (a) It is hereby declared to be the intention of the Mayor and Council that all sections,
90 paragraphs, sentences, clauses and phrases of this Ordinance are and were, upon their enactment,
91 believed by the Mayor and Council to be fully valid, enforceable and constitutional.

92 (b) It is hereby declared to be the intention of the Mayor and Council that, to the
93 greatest extent allowed by law, each and every section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of
94 this Chapter is severable from every other section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this
95 Ordinance. It is hereby further declared to be the intention of the Mayor and Council that, to the
96 greatest extent allowed by law, no section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this
97 Ordinance is mutually dependent upon any other section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase
98 of this Ordinance.

99 **SECTION III.**

100 (a) This Ordinance shall be codified in a manner consistent with the laws of the State
101 of Georgia and the City.

102 (b) In the event that any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section of this
103 Ordinance shall, for any reason whatsoever, be declared invalid, unconstitutional or otherwise

104 unenforceable by the valid judgment or decree of any court of competent jurisdiction, it is the
105 express intent of the Mayor and Council that such invalidity, unconstitutionality or
106 unenforceability shall, to the greatest extent allowed by law, not render invalid, unconstitutional
107 or otherwise unenforceable any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs or
108 sections of the Ordinance and that, to the greatest extent allowed by law, all remaining phrases,
109 clauses, sentences, paragraphs and sections of the Ordinance shall remain valid, constitutional,
110 enforceable, and of full force and effect.

111 (c) The effective date of this Ordinance shall be the date of adoption unless otherwise
112 stated herein.

113 (d) All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance are, to the
114 extent of such conflict, hereby repealed.

115 (e) The preamble of this Ordinance shall be considered to be and is hereby
116 incorporated by reference as if fully set out herein.
